## THE PASTOR SHARES



**SUMMER ADULT EDUCATION CLASS**

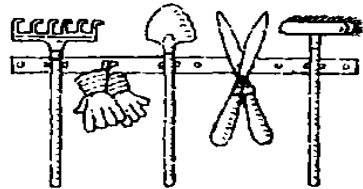

**MISSION OUTREACH NEWS****ACTIVITIES AND PROJECTS**

The United Methodist Church declared ministry with the poor one of its four areas of focus. The Mission Team decided to focus our monthly activities for the remainder of this year on the two issues of poverty in our community: Hunger and homelessness.

We are a generous church and when called upon we donate and give of our time and energy. Please consider helping with the following monthly activities by contributing or volunteering.

**Saturday, June 11:** Volunteers are needed to serve lunch at The Family Place, a day center in St. Paul for homeless families. You will experience God's blessings by reaching out to serve families who are experiencing hardship and depending upon those of us who can help them in their current situation.

We encourage parents, youth and all caring people to sign up at the welcome center in the narthex.

**August:** Once again we will collect school supplies for children living in poverty in our community. Watch for the donation box beginning August first.

**September:** We will be collecting and assembling toiletry items in individual kits for distribution to youth who are members of a homeless family.

**Sunday afternoon, October 9:** the AHUMC congregation is invited to participate in the St. Paul Area CROP HUNGER WALK. The walk provides us the opportunity to do something together about hunger issues, a way to support local hunger programs in our own community, and a way to make a lasting difference in the fight against hunger. The walk will begin at Camphor UMC in St. Paul. More information will be forthcoming in early September. Plan to be a part of making a huge statement by your presence at the CROP HUNGER WALK. We will have fun!

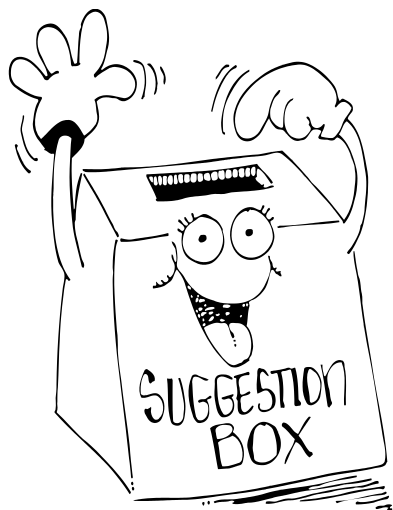
