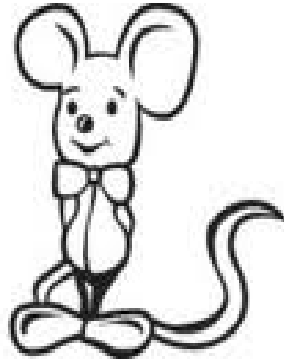

Since downsizing my appetite, losing weight, and having a daughter go off to college, Lori and I have not sufficiently changed our shopping habits. Old habits die hard but we're learning! We learned to stretch our resources by shopping sales with coupons and stocking up which means that we now have a pantry overflowing with food. That's a problem easily solved! It's time for us to pack some bags and boxes for the food shelf! I refuse to believe that any child or adult should be hungry in this great country of ours. We're blessed to be able to share.

I want to share the opportunity for you to bless others as well. It is a joy to have a generous heart! Though many are struggling, most of us have good jobs, health care, and enough. On October 9 AHUMC will participate in the CROP Walk for Hunger for the very first time! 25% of the funds raised will go to local food shelves and 75% will go to offer relief to the hungry around the world. CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES**SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS**

Sunday School will end this rotation with a UNICEF Party on Sunday, October 30. During October the Sunday School will be collecting money for UNICEF. Every day, an estimated 22,000 children die from causes that are totally preventable – because they don't have access to clean drinking water, basic childhood medical attention, sufficient nutrition, or immunization that can protect them against deadly diseases.

- 25 cents gives 10 kids clean water to drink for a day
- \$1 pays for protein biscuits for a starving child
- \$24 supplies and emergency first aid kit
- \$257 buys a School-in-a-box so kids can learn anywhere
- \$500 provides a water pump for a village or school

Last year our children collected over \$150 for UNICEF. If children all across the United States collect money for these causes, together we can make a huge difference.

LIVING THE ABUNDANT LIFE

Please mark your calendar for October 12 at 6:30 when Jan Thatcher Adams will speak in the Fireside Room to talk about her inspirational life story.

Originally from Boone, Iowa, Jan Thatcher Adams at age 18 married Karl Kassulke and became “the football wife”. (Karl Kassulke played for the MN Vikings from 1963-1973) In her book, *The Football Wife*, Jan writes of her fabled and failed marriage, drug abuse, alcoholism, infidelity, the cult of celebrity and the devastating neurological and physical results of recurrent concussions among

NFL players. Jan became a medical doctor and was a family practice doctor for 35 years. She co-founded The People's Clinic, a free clinic near the University of MN, and also co-founded the Sundance Clinic, a group practice in several MN communities. Later in life Jan clowned in Russia with Dr. Patch Adams and founded the nonprofit foundation Maria's Children International which has given art support and funding serving thousands of Russian orphans and to similar projects in Mexico.

Jan Thatcher Adams is a retired medical doctor, humanitarian, church organist, cancer survivor, mother and grandmother. Please join us for an inspiring evening!

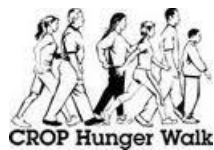
BRIDGE CARD GROUP
